RULES AND CONDITIONS - PLEASE READ: Important points have been highlighted for emphasis.

- 1. In these rules, the Committee shall mean the Music Committee of the Port Macquarie & District Eisteddfod Society Inc.
- 2. The Committee reserves the right to call upon any competitor, except in Open Sections, at any time, to furnish at his/her own expense, proof of age, and to withhold any prize until such proof has been provided. The competitor's age shall be calculated as at the opening date (August 30th 2010.) No entry will be accepted unless it is presented on the official entry form and accompanied by full entry fees.
- 3. All entries must be lodged at the address on the first sheet of this syllabus and be post marked **on or before the** <u>closing date, Friday 2nd July 2010.</u> Teachers please photocopy or download extra entry forms as required.
- 4. Should the Committee be convinced that any entry has been made in error, the Committee reserves the right to transfer such entry to the correct section.
- 5. In sections for Duets and Ensembles the names of all competitors must be included on <u>one</u> entry form, and entries placed into the section of the oldest competitor. Duet and ensemble pieces in vocal and instrumental sections may be accompanied. An ensemble only, may include one teacher in support.
- 6. No entry fee shall be refunded except where the Committee withdraws a section.
- 7. No competitor (teacher excepted, see rule 5) may appear more than once in any section.
- 8. <u>NOVICE SECTIONS</u> apply to competitors, regardless of age, <u>who have had no more than 12 months tuition</u> <u>and have never entered the relevant division of the PM Eisteddfod before.</u> Competitors in these sections are also invited to enter in their age sections.
- 9. These competitions are restricted to **amateurs only**, amateur meaning one whose major income is not derived from the teaching or the exercising of his/her musical talents in the particular sections entered. (Exception see rule 5)
- 10. No entry will be accepted from any person who is, or was, during the twelve months immediately preceding the Eisteddfod, a pupil of the Adjudicator.

PROGRAM:

- 11. Competitors shall compete in the order in which their names appear on the official program and if not present when called upon, may render themselves liable to disqualification.
- 12. The Committee reserves the right to amend the program at any time by varying the order of competitors and/or times of sections, when this is deemed necessary.
- 13. Requests made by parents and/or competitors to rearrange performing times due to sporting commitments clashing, etc. will **not** be considered by the Committee <u>once the program has been printed.</u>
- 14. The Committee reserves the right to cancel or merge sections if there are insufficient entries in any section. If sections are merged this will be indicated in the program.

CHOICE OF MUSIC:

- 15. In all sections consideration will be given to the quality of choice of the competitor's music.
- 16. A competitor <u>must not</u> repeat a selection by him/her at a previous Port Macquarie & District Music Eisteddfod.
- 17. No competitor shall render the same item in more than one section.
- 18. All items presented must be from the <u>Classical Repertoire</u> except where otherwise stated.
- 19. All items are own choice unless otherwise stated.
- 20. Unless otherwise stated, only one piece of music is to be performed.
- 21. Time limits must be adhered to. The adjudicator will use the bell to stop a performance if it exceeds the time limit.
- 22. Repeats are not expected, however DS markings should be observed. Repeats are acceptable in novice sections.

ACCOMPANIMENTS

23. A piano only will be allowed for accompanying unless <u>otherwise stated in the syllabus</u>. Competitors/groups requiring accompaniment may provide their own accompanist or make use of the Official accompanists who have been appointed for the Eisteddfod. (See pg.3) You must make contact with the accompanist by the date stated and music (clearly labelled with competitor's name and section) must be forwarded to the accompanist by the specified date. This will ensure that adequate time is available for rehearsals with the accompanist.

Remuneration for this is a private matter between the performer/s and the accompanist.

24. **Backing CDs are only permitted where specifically mentioned in the syllabus.** These must be professionally produced and labelled (competitor/section/track no.). The part of the competitor must not be present in the backing. No backing vocals permitted. <u>Use of microphones not permitted unless stated in syllabus.</u> Competitors are reminded regarding copyright obligations.

AT THE EISTEDDFOD:

- 25. No practices by competitors in the venue are permitted for one month prior to the Eisteddfod, except for the tuning of instruments to the piano immediately before the relevant section.
- 26. <u>All competitors must</u> bring to the music table at least 15 minutes before their section commences, a copy of their music for the adjudicator. The melody line and lyrics are required in all Vocal sections. <u>Music is to be marked with section number and competitor's number according to the program</u>. <u>A signed photocopy declaration must be attached</u>. All bars are to be numbered. Hand written copies are not permitted except in special circumstances and only with the prior permission of the Director. Hand written or computer-generated copies will be accepted for 'own composition' sections.

Photocopied material handed in will be retained by the Committee to be destroyed according to Copyright rules. Please do not submit original music.

- 27. No parent or teacher will be permitted on the platform with a competitor unless acting as accompanist, conductor or carrying out an official function.
- 28. <u>The use of any photographic device, including mobile phones, is not permitted</u> during a performance under any circumstances. <u>Recording of performances</u> (audio and audiovisual) is not permitted under any circumstances. This is to ensure that we comply with strict copyright and child protection legislation.
- 29. The Committee takes every care but accepts no responsibility for loss or damage to music, book, paper, instruments, costumes or equipment.
- 30. Adjudicator's Reports may be collected 15 minutes after the end of each adjudication from the music table or at the end of the session.
- 31. The decision of the Committee, in all disputes arising out of, or not provided for in these rules, shall be final. Protests, if any, shall be lodged in writing with the Session Coordinator within a quarter of an hour after competition is completed in the section in respect of which the protest is entered. A deposit of \$20.00 must accompany the protest, which shall be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous or unfounded.
- 32. **Presentation and dress**: It is in the competitor's own interest that they pay special attention to their dress and presentation when competing in the Eisteddfod. These constitute part of the performance and are taken into consideration by the Adjudicator. Competitors are also reminded to conduct themselves in a proper manner both on stage and off, and show respect and support for other competitors.

Each competitor/s will be introduced prior to their performance. Competitors are requested **not to verbally address the audience before commencing their performance**. Acknowledging the audience by bowing is polite stage etiquette.

ADJUDICATION AND PRIZES:

- 33. The Adjudicator, at all times, reserves the right to terminate, at any stage, a competitor's performance. This does not indicate disapproval or disqualification.
- 34. No parent, teacher, competitor or any other interested person shall be allowed to approach the adjudicator during a session. All enquiries must be made through the director or at the music table.
- 35. If, through unforseen circumstances, an Adjudicator is unable to perform his/her duties, the Committee reserves the right to appoint a substitute.
- 36. Second place prizes will be awarded when there are four or more competitors in a section, and third place prizes will be awarded when there are six or more competitors. Large sections (more than 12 competitors) may be split.
- 37. The Adjudicator shall have the power to award prizes in all sections but, if a satisfactory standard not be reached, to reduce or withhold prizes.
- 38. The Committee reserves the right to substitute a prize of equivalent value for any prize listed.
- 39. All awards will be made at the discretion of the adjudicator.

Failure to comply with any of the foregoing rules and conditions may involve disqualification and/or withholding of prizes. All entries received are subject to this proviso, which shall not be subjected to any appeal at law, as being contrary to the spirit of friendly competition on which the Eisteddfod is based.

- Playing time 10 minutes total
- All Competitors in the Junior and Open Pianoforte Championships must also perform in at least two other Pianoforte Sections.
- First work to be from the baroque or classical period. Second work to be of a contrasting style. Credit will be given for the quality of choice of music.
- A first prize of \$300.00(snr) and \$150.00(jnr) will only be awarded if: there are at least three competitors, and a suitable standard has been obtained. In the case that either or both of these conditions are not met the committee reserves the right for the prize to be reduced or withheld at the discretion of the adjudicator.

AGGREGATE TROPHY** - 14 yrs & under pianoforte

A perpetual trophy will be awarded to the competitor who gains the highest number of points in the following sections:

- 014 Piano solo
- 019 Australian Composer
- 023 Baroque
- **031** 20th/21st Century Composer

Points in each section will be awarded as follows:

First Place = 5 points Second Place = 3 points Third Place = 1 point

- Competitors must perform in all four sections
- Competitors in younger age groups(i.e. 12/U, 10/U, 8/U) are also invited to enter the 14/U sections and be eligible for the aggregate trophy.
